16. INTERRELATIONSHIP OF BUILDING AND SURROUNDINGS:

Part of a neighborhood of mixed use residential and commercial buildings, this bank's facade (east) fronts Park Street. Bordered to the west by its property line, this building is bordered to the south by its parking lot and the north by a similarly scaled structure.

17. OTHER NOTABLE FEATURES OF BUILDING OR SITE (interior and/or exterior):

This 2 storey flat-roofed building is rectangular in plan with a south side wing and drive-in teller's booth. The building is sheathed with square, pink tile. The fenestrated facade features 3 bays of tinted glass windows on the 2nd floor. The 1st floor features a center display window with prominent sign above. The inset glass door entrance is located on the north side. The building is sheathed with decorative applied fiberglass panelling along its cornice and spaced between its windows.
