• Interrelationship of building and surroundings: Lenzi Park is located along Jefferson Street between St. John Street and Grand Avenue; one block to the east is the elevated I-91 highway. The park is located two blocks north of Wooster Square, and is surrounded by 19th and early-20th-century homes on St. John Street, commercial structures on Grand Avenue, and Modernist buildings on Hughes Place, Greene Street, Wooster Street, and Chapel Street (see Inventory forms for 511 Chapel Street, 285 Greene Street, and 6-30 Court Street).		
• Other notable features of building or site (Interior and/or E	Exterior)	
Lenzi Park is composed of a rectangular grassy plot of land, which serves as the main park space, and a widened stretch of sidewalk along Jefferson Street. The main section contains a curving walkway, which runs along the park's north-south axis, and is accented by recently-planted cherry trees. A mural has also been painted on the south façade of a building bordering the north end of the park, and is currently considered part of the park. A simple wrought-iron fence also surrounds the grassy space. North of the main park plot, a grouping of concrete stools or bollards in various shapes and sizes is spread along the center of the sidewalk on the east side of Jefferson Street. Shade trees are interspersed among the concrete stools. The fence stools and trees, and a few benches, appear to be the only remaining features of Dan Kiley's 1970 design.

<ul> <li>Historical or Architectural importance: First constructed in 1955 by the New Haven Redevelopment Agency, and redesigned by renowned landscape architect Dan Kiley in 1970, Lenzi Park was part of the New Haven "playground modernization program" which placed numerous parks on designated lots in commercial, industrial, and residential sectors of the city. The park was erected on the site of the former Eaton School and named after Joseph Lenzi, a marine who grew up in the neighborhood and was killed on Iwo Jima during WWII. The purpose of such a park was described in Mary Hommann's Wooster Square Design: "In addition to helping to beautify the neighborhood, the objective of these new parks [was] to coordinate dispersed development and community facilities." However, the park's condition severely deteriorated in the 1980s and 1990s. In 2001, the park received a Forest Service grant for its rehabilitation, which included the removal of its Kiley-designed features (such as the playground structure) and the addition of a new pathway, new trees, and a mural painted on the side of a structure bordering the park at its north end.</li> <li>Sources: Brown, Elizabeth Mills; New Haven: <i>A Guide to Architecture &amp; Urban Design</i>, Yale U. 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


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
