• Historical or Architectural importance: The Teamsters Union, Local 443 was built in 1963 as part of an 11-acre industrial development between the new elevated highway, the railroad line, and the Mill River. The industrial park way Wooster Square Redevelopment Area, underway by the late 1950s. By locating the industrial Route 5 (eventually I-91) corridor, planners hoped to provide a divide between residential and Square area as determined by project architect and planner James Skerritt. 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


