This white, cut-stone church is rectangular in plan with a 3 storey tower on the southeast corner. Adjacent to the tower on the front (east) facade is the entrance. The double steel doorway has transom above and sidelights. A concrete overhang surmouthis with a large plate glass light above. The remainder of the facade is uninterrup, except by a wooden cross. A band of smooth square concrete blocks cap the walls.


The north elevation has a projecting steel frame bay which supports a wall of concrete into which are set pieces of stained glass.
