DESCRIPTION (Continued)	Rectangular, block building with a flat roof in the Modern style.  3 metal & plate glass garage doors symmetrically placed on 1st floor of facade. Doors composed of rows of rectangular panes, each row having different sized panes. Fire engines visible through glass doors. 2nd story of facade composed of concrete molded into clapboard-like forms. Rectangular and square glass plates form T-shaped windows. On either sid of central pavilion are "half-gables" of brick and concrete. Square brick columns on right side of facade; these square columns seen on all sides of structure.  South side of building is windowless, with the exception of a narrow plate glass window in a 2nd story half-gable projection. Projecting square & rectangular brick columns, with half-gable concrete capitals, symmetrically
