This building stands in a neighborhood of mixed scale and uses.

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This building consists of a stuccoed commercial entrance wedged between 2 frame buildings whose fronts have been extensively altered.

SIGNIFICANCE
Architect:Builder:
Little remains visible of the 2 original structures on this lot. The southernmost, 64 Howe Street, was owned from ca. 1868 to after 1900 by Charles C. Smith of the New Have
Baking Company Smith was born in New Haven in July, 1842. His father, Mathew, was one
of the incorporators of a cracker manufacturing firm in 1852. Charles became the secreta
in the 1860's and later, treasurer. The firm was among New England's largest commercial bakeries in the '80's. In 1892 Charles sold the firm to the National Biscuit Company
but maintained managerial control. He was a well-known and admired New Haven businessman
